SHARING STORIES

Sharing stories is a fantastically fun way to celebrate the joy of books and reading with children of all ages and spark their imagination. Parents, carers, siblings and friends spending just 10 minutes a day reading with children can help to create readers for life.

STRIVE to make your child a more confident reader by following these easy strategies:

SUPPORT: Give your child lots of positive praise, support and encouragement, before, after and during reading.

TELL: Can your child tell you what they think will happen next?

RETRIEVE: Can your children retrieve information from the text if you ask questions?

INFER: Can your child use clues from the text (infer information) to say how someone is feeling or what might happen?

VOCABULARY: Can your child tell why the author has used certain vocabulary in the text?

EVALUATE: Can your child evaluate what they have read? Did they enjoy what they read? Why or why not?

HAND WASHING

Please can we ask that you do not send your child into school with hand sanitiser. We have dispensers around school containing hand sanitizer, that the children can freely access. The best method of defence is effective hand washing.

Please be assured that regular hand washing is now part of the children's routine and there is plenty of soap in school for the children to wash their hands.

Children will now be washing their hands on arriving at school, before and after break times and PE lessons, before and after lunch and before leaving school. There is antibacterial soap and paper towels in the classrooms for them to use. If your child is sensitive to the soap, they are welcome to bring in hand cream or specific soap to use in school.
