LOCKDOWN ALARM SYSTEMS AND FIRE DRILLS

You may have heard on the very first day back at school, the loud unmistakable sound of our newly installed lockdown alarm system. This along with a fire alarm system are all part of many ways in which we keep your children safe at school.

At Amblecote, we hold a termly unannounced fire practise and with new staff, new children and children in new classrooms, it is vital that we all are aware of our quickest and safest routes out of the building.

We will now also at some point this term be holding a lockdown practise. There are a wide variety of scenarios which may trigger school's lockdown procedures. Some examples may include:

- A reported incident/civil disturbance in the local area;
- An intruder on the school site;
- A warning being received regarding a risk locally of air pollution;
- A major fire in the vicinity of the school;
- The close proximity of a dangerous dog roaming loose or other dangerous animal.

Our updated Lockdown Policy and Procedures are available on our school website and the children will be prepared for the practice as it will be the first time they will have heard the new sirens.

My sister in law's school, in Solihull, had to a instigate a Lockdown, a couple of years ago after a bull entered their playground!!
