
Phase: Reception Focus: Festivals and Celebrations

## What I should already know?

I will have a sense of my own family and friends. I should have some awareness of family celebrations e.g. birthdays, weddings and be able to talk briefly about them. In pretend play, I can imitate everyday actions and events from my own family, such as making and drinking tea. I may be starting to learn that I have similarities and differences that connect me to others, or distinguish me from them.





## **Magic Questions!**

What do we celebrate? What do other people celebrate? How are you the same/different in your traditions?

What do you like to do? What don't you like doing? Do other people always like the same things as you?

Can you remember your Auntie's wedding/last Christmas/your 4th birthday party? What happened? Who was there? How did we celebrate?

What makes you special? What makes your friend special?

What have you learnt about Diwali/Christmas/The Nativity/Bon fire night? Who/what would you like to know more about?



## By the end of the unit I should ...

- Show interest in the lives of people who are familiar to me.
- Remember and talk about significant events in my own experience (past and present).
- Recognise and describe special times or events for family or friends.
- Show interest in different ways of life.
- Know some of the things that make me unique, talking in more detail about similarities and differences between friends and family.
- I enjoy joining in with family customs and routines.
- Understand that other people/families have different customs and celebrate in different ways.
- I know that other children don't always like the same things as me.
- Recognise the similarities and differences between my own and others beliefs, celebrations and customs.
