Primary Colours	Red, blue and yellow are primary colours and are used to make other colours
shades	The darkness or lightness of a colour
technique	A way of doing something

Skills and techniques

Lines and Marks— invent new lines eg wiggly, wavy, curvy
 Painting— Use a variety of tools and techniques including different brush sizes and types of implements.
 Show expression by loose and free painting
 Develop accuracy by representational painting
 Identify Primary Colours and name them
 Mix Primary shades and tones
 Sand Sculptures: Manipulate malleable materials and experiment

 Collage: everyday materials (link to Science)

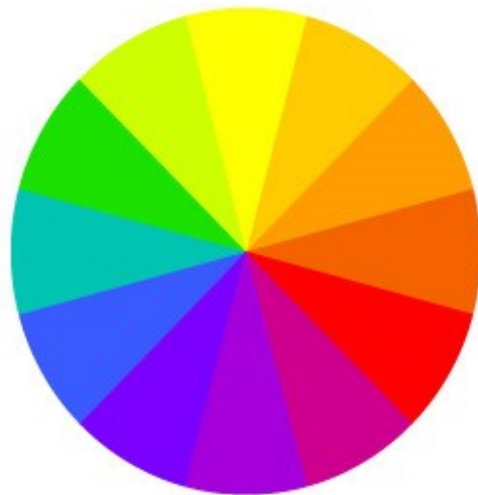

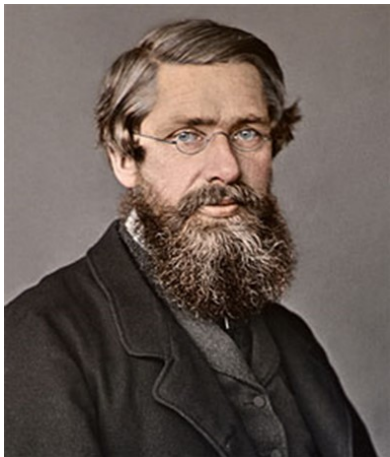
