Please be reassured that all home learning overviews will continue to be sent out weekly. Once / if we are back, a member of staff will be phoning you all to see if there is any other way that we can support you at home, providing additional materials etc. Please keep sending in photographs and updates of what you have been doing at home, via the class email, so we can share these with the children who are in school!

Thank you to all of our parents who are key workers for all that you have done and continue to do and to your children who have joined us every week, since Monday 23rd March. They have all been simply fantastic. Further on in my newsletter there is a little tribute to all of them.
