
What I should already know?

I should have joined fabric in simple ways by gluing and stitching. I've used simple patterns and templates for marking out. I have evaluated a range of textile products

<u>Vocabulary</u>		
Fabric	Cloth or other material produced by weaving or knitting fibres:	
Fastening	A device that closes or secures something	
Compartment	A separate section or part of a structure or container.	
Stiffening	material used to stiffen a gar- ment, fabric, or other object	
Stitch	A loop of thread or yarn resulting from a single pass or movement of the needle in sewing, knitting, or crocheting.	
Seam	A line of stitches that joins pieces of fabric together.	
Seam allowance	Extra fabric allowed for joining together- usually 1.5cm	
Appliqué	Means 'applied' - describes method of stitching/gluing patches onto fabric (originally to mend holes in worn clothes) to provide decoration.	
Pattern/ Template	A shape drawn to exact shape and size and used to assist cutting out.	
Prototype	A model that is made to test whether a design will work.	
Aesthetics	The way in which the product looks with the nature and expression of beauty.
