	<u>Vocabulary</u>				
Primary colours	Red, yellow and blue. Colours that cannot be made by mixing other paints, pure colours that are the basis of all colours				
Silhouette	Using the outline/ shape of an object using only tone, against a coloured lighter background				
wash	A colour produced using watercolour paints and a larger amount of water to create a more transparent, paler colour.				
abstract	The representation of something that is not a tangible object e.g. a feeling, atmosphere, quality				
Observational drawing	drawing or painting from life				
Atmosphere	The feeling created through the use of colour, shape, representation often linked to mood, effect or weather				
Vanishing point	The point on the horizon line which objects cannot be seen; single point perspective				
Perspective	To create the illusion of objects receding in size as they are further away				
Intersection	Using an intersection to create perspective above and underneath the horizon line

	<u>Materials and Mediums</u>
Wax resistant	To apply wax using wax based crayons or adhesives in order to prevent paint taking the effect on the surface of the paper.
Watercolour	Lightweight transparent paint mixed with water, no/invisible texture
Acrylic paint	Modern day version of oil paints but much easier to use. Thick in texture, bold vibrant colour, not transparent. Can be applied using brush, palette knife, sponge, fingers. Also can be mixed with other rough materials to create different textures and effects.
Application	The method and tools used to apply paint to the surface of paper/canvas
Collage	To use materials/items attached to a surface to represent a form (object) feeling or abstract atmosphere/mood
Line drawing	To understand single vanishing point and perspective
Tempera	A flat matt paint with a dry and chalky quality

Skills and techniques

Colour mixing; using water colour, and acrylic paint

Using a single vanishing point for perspective to draw landscapes and cityscapes

Using an intersection to create perspective

To select methods of applying paints to create mood/ atmosphere

To use a variety of mixed mediums for different effects in one piece of art

To draw background, middle ground and foreground using techniques to show perspective (example ariel perspective)
