Report from Full Governing Body

In the spring and summer term Full Governing Body meetings the governors have raised standards by:

- undertaking a thorough evaluation, with all stakeholders, of the Remote Learning Offer provided during partial opening of schools, and determining that Amblecote provided an excellent quality of learning for all pupils
- ensuring that the wellbeing of pupils, staff and the headteacher is given the highest priority
- examining achievement and progress data, and considering how catch-up funding is being spent to make sure gaps in learning are being addressed
- revising and updating the Risk Assessment for the Summer Term in light of full opening in March
- looking ahead at pupil numbers and classroom sizes for the next academic year to ensure the effective deployment of learning resources
- discussing the format of parent consultations and considering the best approaches to benefit all stakeholders
- reviewing policies to ensure school operates to the highest standards
- considering governor vacancies, future recruitment and succession planning so that the governing body continues to have all the skills required to fulfil its functions
