Excited- Feeling very happy. 	Tuning into Sounds We are learning to develop oral blending and segmenting of sounds in words. Collect a selection of objects with names containing three phonemes (e.g. zip, hat, bag, dog, boat, tap, bin). Play I spy. I spy with my little eye a z-i-p. Then invite your child to say the name of the object and hold it up. Ask your child to say the individual phonemes and blend them together 'z-i-p, zip'. When your child has become familiar with this game use objects with names that start with the
Say the word. Clap the syllables. Talk about what each word means. Can your child use these words correctly in a sentence?	same initial phoneme (e.g. cat, cap, cup, cot, comb, kite). This will really encourage the children to listen and then blend right through the word, rather than relying on the initial sound.
