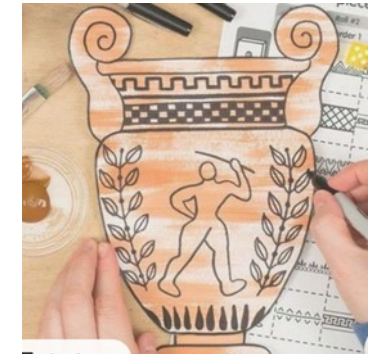
## What I should already know?

Colour mixing; Primary colours mixed to make secondary colours  
 Wash; Pupils mix a small amount of paint with larger amount of water to create a transparent effect  
 Cool and Warm colours; To understand the "feel" of colours, the warm and cool colours  
 Paper sculpting techniques; rolling, twisting, scrunching

## Vocabulary

<b>Greek column</b>	Ancient classical period of architecture seen in ancient Greek buildings
<b>motif</b>	decorative image or design, especially a repeated one forming a pattern. "the colourful hand-painted motifs which adorn narrowboats"
<b>illustration</b>	A simplified image representing an object or living thing
<b>classic</b>	The term classicism is used to describe art that makes reference to ancient Greek or Roman style.
<b>symbolic</b>	When images, language or gestures are linked to a belief, emotion or story
<b>Wash</b>	A very weak colour made using a small amount of water colour paint and water
<b>Paper sculpture</b>	To create a 3D design using a variety of paper and cardboard through experimenting with shape, using skills in cutting, folding, bending, strengthening and attaching.
<b>Embellish</b>	make (something) more attractive by the addition of decorative details or features.
<b>Collage</b>	a piece of art made by sticking various different materials such as photographs and pieces of paper or fabric on to a backing.
<b>Scrolls</b>	A curled sculpted piece of stone placed at the top of Greek columns

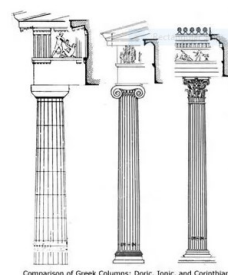
### Ancient Greek Vases

Vases were mostly made and painted in Sparta, Crete and Cyprus.

Some of the popular paintings on vases were circles or geometric shapes.

Some vases were covered in triangles.

Many artists painted human figures, animals such as birds and cows or other figures.



### Ancient Greek Columns Facts

The Doric style is the most plain and simple.

The Ionic style is more slender and more ornate than the earlier Doric style column.

The Corinthian style is quite fancy and decorated with acanthus leaves and flowers.
