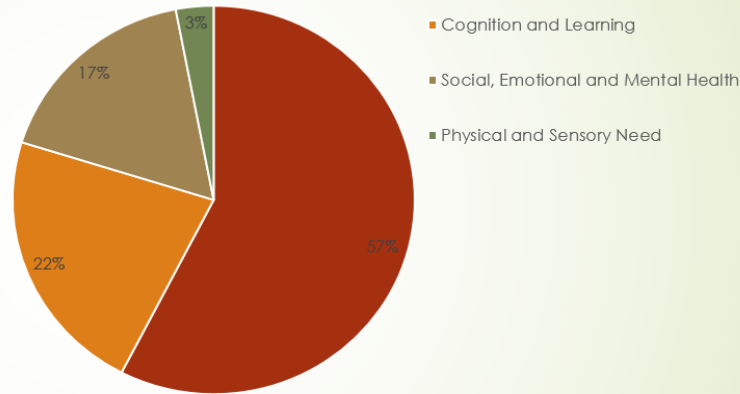


At Amblecote, Communication and Interaction is our highest area of need for SEND, followed by Cognition and Learning. This is a similar picture to National figures as top two areas of need are Communication and Interaction and Cognition and Learning.

Broad Areas of Need



We are an inclusive school and have a higher than average number of children with SEND at Amblecote.

Priorities:

1. Improve provision for our SEND children.
2. Ensure our curriculum is personalised around our children's needs, reflecting their individual requirements, whilst still promoting high aspirations for all.
3. Monitor progress of pupils with SEND and where required at a granular level.

SEND Pupils

Boys – 63% Girls – 37%

This is in line with national figures 64% boys and 36% girls.
