Can you work out how many objects are hiding now?



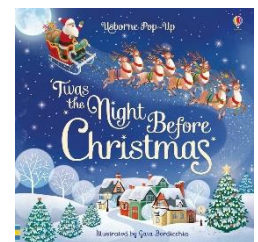
Once you have made your prediction, count the objects to check.
